Call to Order

The Executive Committee of the Longwood University Board of Visitors met on Thursday, September 10 at the Joan Perry Brock Center at Longwood University. The meeting was called to order at 1:47 p.m. by Rector Jeff Nottingham.

Nottingham congratulated Scott on the dedication of the N.H. “Cookie” Scott Center at Lankford Hall prior to the meeting, and thanked Board members for their dedication and service.

President Reveley provided an update on the state of enrollment and national challenges that are affecting higher education nationwide. Booth began a discussion on demographic trends and Reveley highlighted several enrollment strategies in place at Longwood. Discussion followed.

Board members discussed items in the consent agenda. President Reveley then further updated the Executive Committee on endowment growth and fundraising goals, potential federal action that could affect higher education, Whitehead Hall construction, the Dean of the Cormier Honors College for Citizen Scholars search, development of an updated strategic plan, thoughts concerning the Yik Yak social media platform, an upcoming event at Hampden-Sydney College related to the publication of a book about the Reveley family, the Alpha Sigma Alpha sorority’s

125th anniversary, head women's basketball coach Erika Lang-Montgomery's keynote address at convocation that afternoon, and the upcoming 25th anniversary of Sept. 11.

Nottingham and Early told Board members present, including new members, that following the Executive Committee meeting in June, there was a consensus that the Board would update the annual presidential evaluation process and input from members.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3 p.m.
